Evidence Requirements

Evidence of efficacy that meets the ESSA standards is required for some federal formula grants. Under ESSA, these programs or interventions require a minimum of one study meeting one category.

It is important to note that the ESSA legislation does not tell states or districts that they must have their efficacy evaluated or rated by any third-party organization.

Evidence Tiers and Apex Learning
