Proven Effective for Alternative Education

Summary

The Cherokee County School District (CCSD) C3 Academy uses Apex Learning Comprehensive Courses as digital curriculum in two programs. In the high school program, students complete Courses to recover credit in a computer lab setting. In the alternative education program, students complete Courses in a blended learning environment taught by a teacher trained to deliver blended learning instruction.

Together, Apex Learning and Cherokee County School District administrators examined Apex Learning records for courses leading to eight Georgia End-of-Course Tests (EOCT) and EOCT assessment results from the 2013 – 2014 school year to assess the impact of Apex Learning Comprehensive Courses on EOCT performance. For each program and programs combined, the achievement of students using Apex Learning Comprehensive Courses on EOCTs was compared to traditional and non-traditional students completing courses for initial credit in traditional classrooms.

Results

Students in the alternative programs using Apex Learning courses for initial credit and credit recovery perform at similar levels to students completing courses for initial credit in traditional classrooms.

In the alternative program, the average EOCT achievement of students using Apex Learning Comprehensive Courses for initial credit and credit recovery in a blended learning environment is not significantly different statistically than for students completing courses for initial credit in traditional classrooms.

In the high school program, the average EOCT achievement of students using Apex Learning Comprehensive Courses for credit recovery is lower compared to students completing coursework for initial credit in a traditional classroom environment. The magnitude of the difference between the performance of the two groups was statistically insignificant.

Further analysis of Apex Learning usage suggests that both average EOCT achievement and pass rates for students who completed 80% of Apex Learning coursework with a quality of work score greater than 80% is not significantly different than students completing non-Apex Learning coursework for initial credit in a traditional classroom.
